

SAFE & SOUND - GUIDELINES FOR PARTNERSHIP FUNDING

1. Applications will be invited during the course of a scheduled 'rollout' across London (to be published). i.e. When the 'Safe & Sound' scheme arrives at various Boroughs, advanced notice will be provided in order that bids might be prepared.
2. Grants will only be made to those that show that they've already developed relationships with the police and their local authority concerning the safety of their venues. This will be under the remit of the Borough Community Safety Strategy and licensing operating plan and there is an expectation that the venue will sign up to local 'Safety' initiatives.
3. Grants under £750 will not have to be matched.
4. a. The maximum grant should be £2000 and this should be matched on a sliding scale i.e. £750 0%, £1,000 - £1,500 50%, £1,501 - £1,999 75%, £2,000 and over 100%.

b. This amount may be exceeded in the case of collective / group bids.
5. The panel may direct or require that a security audit be carried out prior to approval of funding.
6. To attract funding, premises must possess a current Music & Dancing license.
7. Funding allocation will favour smaller, owner / occupier type venues as opposed to 'chains'.
8. Whilst innovation is encouraged, bids should generally be made for crime prevention measures detailed within the 'Safe & Sound' guide.
9. Any equipment purchased remains the property of the 'Safe & Sound' partnership.
